Each section of the guide builds on the other sections. Each publisher or supplier is listed in an appropriate section but is not usually listed again when the scope of their resource covers more than one section. It is thus important to use all sections and to write to the publishers and suppliers in each section to obtain their catalogues from which to make your selections.

In the section on material produced by or for Aboriginal health workers, and health education and promotion in Aboriginal communities, full listings of material have been provided ready to be copied and used as order forms.

The purpose of this guide is to share the information as widely as possible.

## 1. Community Health Workers: The International Context

When delegates from the member countries of the World Health Organization (WHO) met at Alma-Ata in 1978, they signed the Declaration of Alma-Ata and committed their countries to a programme to achieve "Health for all by the year 2000".

More and better primary health care is recognized as the key to better health for all, and community health workers are the front line people in the provision of primary health care.

The WHO defines primary health care as:

**"essential health care made accessible at a cost the country and community can afford, with methods that are practical, scientifically sound and socially acceptable. Everyone in the community should have access to it, and everyone should be involved in it .."**

**It should include:**

- \* **education of the community on the health problems prevalent and on the methods of preventing health problems from arising or of controlling them;**
- \* **the promotion of adequate supplies of food and of proper nutrition;**
- \* **sufficient safe water and basic sanitation;**
- \* **maternal and child health care, including family planning;**
- \* **the prevention and control of locally endemic diseases;**
- \* **immunization against the main infectious diseases;**
- \* **appropriate treatment of common diseases and injuries;**
- \* **the provision of essential drugs.**

(Glossary of terms 1984).

Community health workers are

**"men and women chosen by the community, and trained to deal with the health problems of individuals and the community, and to work in close relationship with the health services."**

(The Community Health Worker, 1987).

An important aspect of their work is to facilitate the development and empowerment of the community to take action to change economic, environmental and lifestyle factors which have an adverse effect on the health of community members.

Aboriginal health workers are community health workers trained to provide primary health care to their communities in Australia.

On an international level, a few publishers have been responsible for producing the majority of the materials to support the training and work of community health workers.

## 2. Aboriginal Studies

Aboriginal studies form an important part of each course. These studies aim to give the student a greater knowledge and understanding of traditional Aboriginal society, history, language and culture. Local and regional materials should be selected as a priority. The students also examine present conditions for urban, country and traditional Aboriginal people and strategies for improving the delivery of health care including their role in community organization and advocacy.

Traditional and contemporary Aboriginal perspectives must also be included in each part of the teaching programme. For example material on bush tucker needs to be acquired to support instruction on diet and nutrition, and any teaching on family planning, contraception etc. will need to incorporate information about traditional practices. Material selected also needs to be appropriately presented and culturally sensitive. One way to ensure that acceptable material is selected is to purchase from Aboriginal organizations.

The literature of Aboriginal health is indexed in a subfile of the Australasian Medical Index, available on-line only via the Australian MEDLINE Network through the National Library of Australia. (Librarians in any health/hospital library will be able to advise and assist with access). This subfile was produced as a book "Aboriginal Health, an Annotated Bibliography", covering the period 1970 to 1985. The monthly Aboriginal Health Information Bulletin supplements this book. The book is available from Aboriginal Studies Press and the Bulletin from the Australian Institute of Health.

As well as including the index to Aboriginal Health, the Australasian Medical Index also contains an index to all kinds of health education and promotion materials (HEAPS) including kits, posters, videos and entire programmes and provides the contact address for each item.
