## WA Forum Report

May is always a full month in the Library and Information calendar and 2002 is packed full of interesting, exciting and thought provoking activities and issues.

Uppermost in my mind this month is the promotion of Library and Information Services. Marketing and promotion are skills, which librarians don't necessarily have or choose to cultivate. Perhaps this is the reason it is so hard to get publicity during Library and Information Week. The LIW 2002 Committee, ably managed by Samantha Hughes form Success Public Library, is busy marketing LIW 2002, arranging events and encouraging the profession to participate.

The LIW 2002 launch at the Constitution Centre will be a star spangled event with the presentation of the Special Librarian of the Year award and Verity James of ABC Radio as the Guest Speaker. The week is then full of interesting programs in all types of libraries, some of which are noted on the ALIA Web page LIW Events calendar. The week will close with a Testimonial Dinner for our newest ALIA Fellow, Kerry Smith who is returning from the ALIA 2002 conference to share her award with her WA Colleagues. I urge you to come along and participate in these events.

Other issues of significance recently are the election to the ALIA Board of Directors of our very own Western Australian candidate, Deanne Barrett of the WA Industrial Relations Commission Library. Deanne will attend her first Board of Directors meeting on 23 May where there will be plenty to discuss. Amongst the board papers will be a submission from the outgoing Deputy Executive Director, Susanne Bruhn on Funding Guidelines for Groups. This a very important step in the management of the Group structure within ALIA and one that requires your careful attention once it is approved by the ALIA Board of Directors.

Also on the agenda for ALIA is the possibility of providing Professional Indemnity Insurance at a very reasonable, albeit much reduced cost to members. Many Librarians now work as contractors in organizations and Professional Indemnity Insurance is a necessary part of the pantheon of coverage if you are a contractor providing people with information or designing systems and services. If you are interested in this form of cover please contact Susanne Bruhn at ALIA National Office before the end of May when she leaves to return to the National Library.

Another issue of concern to the profession at the moment is the Library and Information Science Education for the Knowledge Age (LISEKA) project submission. The following information, extracted from an Email by Marie Murphy summarizes the project.

"The working group has been concentrating on identifying new approaches to the career-long education of information workers at professional and technician levels. The approaches are based on an analysis of developing educational and employment opportunities and target the widening of career options for ALIA members at the beginning of the 21st century.

Two proposed new models have been developed and are compared with the status quo. The working group is now seeking feedback from ALIA Groups and, more generally ALIA members, about the proposed models. To enable Groups sufficient time to meet and/or discuss the material the deadline for comments to ALIA National Office is Friday 21 June 2002.

In commenting on the models it is important to remember that they are designed to stimulate debate and are not exclusive of other ideas.

## Net Notes: Email lists

If you want to discuss librarianship issues there are plenty of discussion lists you can join. For Australia alone there would probably be over 100 lists as ALIA and the National Library support nearly 70 lists and there are a number of lists independent of those institutions. By checking the websites of ALIA and the National Library and following their links to other lists, you will be able to track down virtually any Australian library discussion list. The main URLs and some of the list commands are given below.

### ALIA e-lists

ALIA currently has 53 e-lists listed at <http://www.alia.org.au/e-lists/alianet.lists.html>. They are generally based on a subject area or library sector, for example, aliaHEALTH, aliaLOCAL, or a state or region. AliaBIBLIA is the only WA based ALIA list; other lists may be run from Western Australia but are national in scope.

ALIA lists use ListProc software so if you are on most of the lists you only have to remember a few commands. One important principle to grasp in handling e-lists is that there are usually two addresses: one to handle commands - subscribe, unsubscribe, and so forth, and a second address which handles messages to the list. The number of subscribe and unsubscribe messages which turn up on the lists I subscribe to suggests that this principle is not fully understood.

### *Subscribing/Unsubscribing to ALIA lists*

Information about subscribing and other important commands is available on ALIANet at <http://www.alia.org.au/e-lists/subscribe.html>. More detailed information is available through the ListProc list-user reference card at <http://www.alia.org.au/e-lists/list-user.html>. A summary of the most useful commands is below.

The address for subscribing, unsubscribing, and other requests is [listproc@alia.org.au](mailto:listproc@alia.org.au) (there are three other aliases which work: [listproc@alianet.alia.org.au](mailto:listproc@alianet.alia.org.au), [listserv@alia.org.au](mailto:listserv@alia.org.au), [listserv@alianet.alia.org.au](mailto:listserv@alianet.alia.org.au)). Please note that commands are not case sensitive and that all commands to listproc should be sent in the body of the message, not as the subject. For "aliaXYZ" substitute the name of the list e.g. aliaNATSPEC.

To subscribe, send the following message (without a subject or signature): subscribe aliaXYZ Jane Doe

To unsubscribe, send the following message: unsubscribe aliaXYZ

To unsubscribe from your old email address, send the following message:  
unsubscribe aliaXYZ for Jane.Doe@whatever.com.au

To unsubscribe from every ALIA list you are on, send this message: PURGE

### *General tips on managing your ALIA lists*

To find out which lists you are on send the following message: WHICH

You will receive a list of the e-lists you have joined (this also happens after using the PURGE command but that is a list of the lists you used to be on).

To receive the digest (one daily email with all messages sent to that list) send the message:  
SET aliaXYZ mail digest

To stop receiving messages while you are away (and avoid everyone on that list seeing your "Jane Doe is out of the office" message ad nauseum as you enjoy your long service leave), send this message:

SET aliaXYZ mail postpone

NB: you can still send mail to the list while it is set on postpone.

To cancel the postpone or digest command, use  
SET aliaXYZ mail ack

NB: use "noack" if you do not want to receive a copy of the messages you send to the list.

### *Sending messages*

Send messages to the list at [aliaXYZ@alia.org.au](mailto:aliaXYZ@alia.org.au) (or to [aliaXYZ@alianet.alia.org.au](mailto:aliaXYZ@alianet.alia.org.au)).

### *Accessing the archives*

If the list has an archive, email [aliaXYZ@alia.org.au](mailto:aliaXYZ@alia.org.au) with this message: index

The reply will list the files available and to get one of these files you will need to send a message in the format: get [archive] [name of file] e.g. get listproc/database/name/oldstuff FAQlist



**National Library of Australia e-lists**

The National Library of Australia hosts 16 e-lists, including COPY-LIB, ILRS-L (Interlibrary Resource Sharing Directory), and Kinetica-L. They are listed, together with basic commands at <http://www.nla.gov.au/nla/listserv/>. ListProc is also used by the National Library so the commands used for ALIA e-lists will also work for these lists. Commands need to be sent to listproc@nla.gov.au and messages need to be sent to [listname]@nla.gov.au e.g. kinetica-l@nla.gov.au.

*Accessing the archives*

Some of the lists have web based archives and you can follow the link from <http://www.nla.gov.au/nla/listserv/>. To access the other list archives you will need to use ListProc commands. Insert the name of the list where "[mailing list]" is used, and the real filename for "[filename]".

To find out what is available send the message: index [mailing list]

To get one of the files, send the message: get [mailing list] [filename]
