## NEW RESOURCE FOR SUICIDE PREVENTION

Concerned communities and health professionals will have better access to suicide prevention information and resources following the launch of a new online exchange.

The Australian Suicide Prevention Information and Resource Exchange, to be known as ASPiRE, is a joint venture between the Telethon Institute for Child Health Research, Woodside Energy Ltd and the Ministerial Council for Suicide Prevention (MCSP).

The MCSP Executive Officer said "ASPiRE has been established in response to needs expressed by agencies and communities for ready access to sound, up to date information to assist in the prevention of suicide".

"As an online service, it is widely accessible to a range of people with varying needs, making this type of information readily available to people at the time that it can be of most benefit."

It is important that people realise ASPiRE is not a counselling service or crisis call centre but is designed to assist agencies and professionals with service provision and program development.

ASPiRE comprises the MCSP website and a database for the library that has in excess of 1,500 items including reports, references and links to journal articles. The database includes material in many formats including reports, training materials, videos, books, journal articles.

Material will not be loaned directly to the public, but made available via the interlibrary loans system. Requests may be submitted by mail, fax or e-mail (NUC symbol WPAS). Standard document delivery charges apply.

## Metadata Hands On Workshop

Metadata. What is it? What can it do? How is it done?

Most courses cover why and what but rarely how, whereas this half-day course covers a wide scope in understanding, creating and using metadata.

You will create metadata using controlled vocabularies and then store the metadata in resources and metadata catalogues. After a group effort, the results of the exercises are viewable and you can make an informed assessment of whether metadata is for you

### Benefits to participants

This course allows participants to be able to be fully informed on the issues surrounding planning, creation and using metadata. (Be prepared to work through the concepts from first principles before metadata is created). Enrolment includes a comprehensive manual.

### Who should attend

Anyone who needs to get a good grasp of metadata. Librarians and cataloguers are urged to attend.

If you need to know if metadata is for you and how it is created with a structured approach then this course is for you.

Bruce is experienced in all forms of computing since 1980 and is an enthusiastic newcomer to the world of structured cataloguing.

## **Indexing Courses Conducted by Australian Society of Indexers' Trainer Max McMaster**

Despite predictions that computers and search engines would make indexing obsolete, quality indexes are here to stay as readers, researchers, publishers, librarians and others admit that quality indexing adds context and integrity to a world otherwise populated by disorganised information.

CAVAL Collaborative Solutions is happy to offer the following training courses for those responsible for the provision of indexes to assist locating information.

### **Journal indexing**

This half day course is specifically designed for anyone responsible for preparing annual or cumulative indexes for journals, magazines, or newsletters in a library, commercial publisher or community group/society setting. The course will cover: deciding what to index; number of indexes to be included; style of author entries; title entries; anonymous items; and selection of subject terms.

### **Refresher Back-of-Book indexing**

Areas to be covered include: selection of headings and sub-headings; formatting of names; cross-references; issues of editing and style; and length of index.

### **Intermediate Back-of-Book indexing**

This full-day course is designed to provide hands-on indexing practice of a small 60 page technical document using one of the commercial dedicated indexing software packages on the market. No specific subject knowledge is required, but a basic knowledge of indexing principles is assumed. By the end of the day students will have fully indexed the document and will be in a position to move on to real world indexing.

All courses are developed and presented by **Max McMaster** who has been a freelance indexer for the past 9 years. Although he has mainly worked on back-of-book indexing, he is also highly experienced in database indexing, journal indexing and web-indexing. He arrived at indexing after spending 19 years in the library and information fields, mainly involved with scientific disciplines in State government departments and CSIRO. He has in excess of 900 indexes to his name. Max lectures on indexing to editing and publishing students at RMIT, and runs indexing training courses for the Australian Society of Indexers and others all around Australia. Max has been awarded the prestigious Australian Society of Indexers Medal on three occasions.

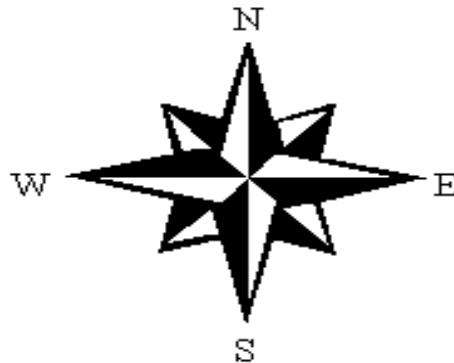
