### MARCH BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Some of the topics and issues discussed at the March meeting were:

- A strategic planning workshop to shape the future of ALIA. Four key themes have been identified and Board members are working on developing background papers for presentation to members as part of the 2003 NPC program.
- Commenced planning for the NPC 2003.
- Finalisation of the annual report and the 2003 budget.
- Evaluation of the Board's performance. Board members will be answering a questionnaire and there was some discussion regarding training and orientation for new Board members.
- ALIA's AGM will be held 15 May 2003 at ALIA House at which the new membership database and REAP research programme will be launched. The Board will meet again May 15-16 with a change over of new Board members.
- The LISEKA stage 2 working group reported on its continued development of the framework and mechanisms for implementation. There is a regular LISEKA column in Incite and this project will be finalised and launched later in the year.
- The final version of the ALIA: Making a difference 2003-2004 plan was endorsed by the Board.

### STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

The Board has developed several partnerships with related organisations.

ALIA has committed to a proposal to maximise co-operation, communication and collaboration on areas of joint concern with Australian Society of Archivists, Museums Australia, and the Australian Institute for Conservation of Cultural Materials.

A co-operation agreement with CONSAL (Congress of Southeast Asian Librarians).

ALIA has a memorandum of understanding with Australian Society of Archivists and the Records Management Association of Australia, and is developing an alliance with Public Libraries Australia Ltd.

ALIA has joined the Regional Cultural Alliance (RCA) with the Federation of Historical Societies, Australian Council of National Trusts, Regional Arts Australia and Museums Australia. The RCA will be launched in October 2003 and has been formed to create a common agenda for creative cultural communities.

### UPDATE ON ALIA'S KEY INITIATIVES

#### **Key Initiative 1 – Develop and market new services for students/new professional members**

The New Generation Policy and Advisory Group tabled a detail plan of activities and strategies at the Board meeting. The Board approved the establishment of a New Graduates Group and this active and enthusiastic group will be very busy over the next 12 months.

#### **Key Initiative 3 Achieve favourable purchasing agreements for institutional members for products and services, including licence agreements**

An ALIA Purchasing and Consortia Reference Group has been formed and the members are Moyra McAllister, Moya Lum, Julie Rae, Richard Sayers, Penny Scott and Susan Magnay. This Reference Group is negotiating an agreement for the establishment of a Co-operative Information Purchasing Service for ALIA institutional members.

## **Preserving Digital Information: Challenges and Solutions**

*Because digital information is being produced so much more rapidly than other forms, libraries and archives of the future will inevitably be libraries and archives of digital content. Just to keep pace with the flood of new digital information, the library and archive of the near future will require the means to collect, describe, make available, store and preserve digital information in the digital domain. Primarily due to their dependence on a rapidly changing technological infrastructure, digital resources are significantly less permanent than their paper-based equivalents. Their enduring accessibility into the future is far from assured. The challenge is too large and complex for any one institution or country to solve on its own, although excellent cooperative work is taking place on this issue around the world - particularly in Australia. However, if we fail to meet this challenge then there will be a permanent hole in our cultural and documentary heritage.*

## Vale Ethel Horner

18 November 1927 - 19 March 2003

Ethel Horner was the inaugural Medical Librarian at Princess Margaret Hospital for Children. She was affectionately known as Eff and joined PMH in 1973 to establish a Medical Library. The Library, as such, at that stage consisted of a very small collection of books, journals and magazines, which were housed in the Medical Director's office. So Eff virtually started from 'scratch', to set up the Hospital's Medical Library.

The Library was small, but vibrant, and the hub of the Hospital's provision of information to medical staff and others. It was also very warm and welcoming - so much so that Eff often had to surreptitiously nudge a very tired and snoring Doctor, nodding over a journal, so that he didn't disturb the avid medical students trying to study nearby!

As the building in which the Medical Library was housed was to be demolished to make way for a new Hospital building, the Library was moved to slightly larger temporary accommodation. Once again Eff set about providing a welcoming and up-to-date Library. It was during this time that Eff commenced agitating for a permanent home for the ever-expanding Medical Library. In 1984 the Medical Library was moved to its current premises and the existing Nurses' Library was amalgamated with the Medical Library.

In those days before automation, electronic access and the Internet, the Medical Library was managed by Eff with her outstanding professional skills, giving meticulous care to detail, and the provision of the most current information to medical and other Hospital staff. Her services were highly valued by all staff members and she would go to endless lengths to provide them with any information they required to solve their problems, and to assist them in the provision of health care within the Hospital, and to other establishments within the State and Australia.

Eff was highly respected by her peers within the library profession and her contribution to librarianship was demonstrated in her willingness to embrace new technology and tools to enhance the Library's role in the Hospital's health-care, and in the profession generally. She was instrumental in establishing the Health Libraries Section of the Library Association of Australia in Western Australia, and was very actively involved in all aspects of her profession.

In 1990 Eff retired to spend more time with her husband Jack. She was looking forward to the arrival of her grandchildren. She was diagnosed to have cancer of the pancreas at the beginning of 2002, but was determined to see the birth of her latest grandchild. Eff passed away on the 19th of March, just three months after the death of her husband.

### **Awards criteria**

Nominees should address each of the selection criteria and give specific examples to demonstrate each. They include:

- Professional / Business Skills
- Technical Skills

#### **Professional / business skills**

1. Delivery of convenient, accessible and cost-effective information services that are aligned with the strategic direction of the organisation/client.
2. Use of appropriate business and management skills to effectively communicate the importance of library and information services to senior management and effectively promote these services to the wider community.
3. Networking and sharing knowledge with others

#### **Technical skills**

1. Expert library technical skills.
2. Specialised subject knowledge appropriate to the business of the organisation or client.
3. Innovation and ability to apply new technologies and techniques to acquire, organise and disseminate information to organisation/client.

### **Rules for nomination for the Special Librarian Award**

#### **Nominee / proposer / seconder**

1. Only financial personal ALIA members are eligible for the award.
2. The name of the award shall be the "The Special Librarian Award."
3. No current committee member is eligible for the award.
4. The nominee for the award must have both a proposer and a seconder. Candidates may self-nominate with a seconder.
5. The proposer and seconder must submit a brief resume about the nominee to the awards committee.
6. The nominee must provide a comprehensive resume, and a document addressing the selection criteria to the awards committee.
7. It must be understood that the nominee may have to attend an interview with a panel.



### Awards committee

1. The awards committee shall consist of at least three members, one of these being the Convenor of the Knowledge and Information Specialists (WA Group).
2. There shall be one member of the committee who is not a librarian and who represents the wider business community.
3. The current award holder shall be invited to participate in the selection process as an award committee member.
4. The award shall not be made to the same person more than once in a five year period.
5. The awards committee has the right to defer the award if the selection criteria are not met.
6. No correspondence shall be entered into with regard to the winner of the award and deliberations of the awards committee shall remain confidential.
7. Advertisements on WAIN, Biblia and inCite will be placed to call for nominations for the award and subsequently to advertise the winner of the award.
8. The awards committee shall reach a decision by the 11<sup>th</sup> April 2003.
