

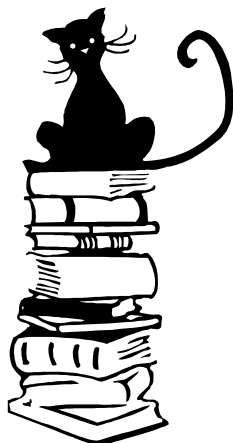

### SHARR MEDAL 2002

The WA Forum awarded the Sharr Medal at the Library & Information Week celebration 12<sup>th</sup> May held at the WA Constitutional Centre. The F A Sharr Medal is an award given to the graduand who exhibits the most potential; the one most likely to have a positive impact on their preferred stream of the library profession. It is named after Francis Aubie (Ali) Sharr, state librarian from Western Australia from 1953 to 1976, in recognition of his contribution to libraries and librarianship in this state and to the profession. This is the first presentation of the award since the passing of Ali Sharr in November 2002.



Nominations came from graduates from Edith Cowan School of Information Studies and Curtin University Department of Media and Information. Certificates of recognition went to finalists Judith Jarvis Graduate Teacher Librarian, Paige Luff Graduate Librarian and Lisa White Graduate Librarian.

Robert Sharman presented the 2002 Sharr Medal to Judith Jarvis and gave a speech on the achievements of Dr Sharr, reminding us all of why Ali Sharr was honoured and recognised for his contribution to Librarianship by the WA library profession. The following is the citation for the 2002 winner Judith Jarvis.

Judith was awarded a Graduate Diploma of Science (Information Services) in 2002. She undertook this course part time at Edith Cowan University and was awarded the ALIA prize for Teacher Librarianship, which is awarded to the graduating student with the highest course average.

Teaching languages to primary school students was Judith's introduction to libraries that created a need to gain library qualifications. One of the issues Judith feels strongly about is the need to create a community of readers. Providing a happy, welcoming atmosphere with smiling faces and bright displays, collaborating with teachers and providing role models are key areas of interest.

Judith has a passion for libraries and books and believes that reading is for pleasure as it enhances lives. She is committed to passing on this passion and her special interest is encouraging boys to read. This is demonstrated by a very successful project implemented by Judith at La Salle College in Midland. Capitalising on her students' admiration for their swimming champions Judith created a display "What Our Champion Swimmers are Reading". The display included a photograph of each champion with details on favourite authors, genres, books and advice to other students. This successful display created much interest and lead to a later similar display of the house captains.

ALIA WA Forum congratulates Judith on her success in winning the F.A. Sharr Medal for 2002. We look forward to Judith's continuing contribution to the profession in Western Australia and wish her every success in her chosen field of Teacher Librarianship.

## MAY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The May Board meeting was held during a very busy Library & Information Week which also saw the launch of the new ALIANet and REAP, two new members on the Board and the Association's AGM.

### NEW ALIANET

The new website was launched on Thursday evening prior to the ALIA Annual General Meeting. It has taken three intensive months of solid work to build ALIA's '5th-generation' website. Ivan and his team hope that you like it, and hope that you enjoy the faster speed of loading, the new chat server, the e-prints repository, the database-driven events pages, the new conference pages, and the members-only material.

Here are some numbers from Ivan to dazzle you: to move and convert the existing 20 000 pages, it took 4 staff working solidly for 3 months to bring you the new site. Integration with the new membership database was handled by contractors who are building the membership database, but essentially the bulk of the work was performed by just 4 ALIA National Office staff. A recent site conversion in America by a similar organisation has these figures: more than 100 staff took 2 years to convert 40 000 pages, at a cost of US\$6 million.

## **2003 WA ALIA Special Librarian Award**

At the Library and Information Week launch on 12 May, KISWA announced that Terena Solomons is the winner of the 2003 Special Librarian Award. Terena was not able to be present to receive the award but Lothar Retzlaff, her work colleague, accepted it on her behalf from Tony Delauney of the Law Shop, sponsor of this year's award.

Terena currently holds the position of Library Manager at Hollywood Private Hospital, a position she has held since late 1997. She is the Chair of the Hospital Policy Committee, and also Chair of the Hospital Intranet Working Committee. An active member of ALIA, Terena is currently a member of the WA mentoring committee and is also a member of the Steering Committee for the State-Wide Library Marketing Campaign. Previous ALIA positions include Branch Councillor and advertising coordinator for Biblia.

Terena was the sponsorship coordinator for the ALIA New Librarians' Symposium, (better known as the "Bright and Funky" conference), held last year in Brisbane. This successful and innovative symposium actually made a profit due to the level of sponsorship achieved. Terena also gave a presentation on the Myer-Briggs personality indicators. Last year Terena was selected to attend the Evidence Based Clinical Practice Workshop in Adelaide and has shared this knowledge at a workshop held in February this year.

Terena's excuse for not being able to accept the award in person is itself an indication of how worthy a recipient of the award she is. Terena is currently in the US as a result of being awarded the 2002 Victorian Association for Library Automation Travel Scholarship. Her research project is "to investigate how North American Medical Libraries are supporting clinicians in the use of PDA's". This involves investigating how medical libraries in North America are implementing and managing hand-held computer technology for their clients. She is also examining the impact that hand-held technology is having on the practice of librarianship, and on the work practices of healthcare professionals.
