TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. Role/Purpose

The role of the IFLA Australian caucus is to provide:

- networking opportunities for Australian participants at WLIC
- information on Australian participants' roles in IFLA
- an opportunity to meet the IFLA President / President elect
- formal opportunity to hear about IFLA strategic issues from GB members, Division Chairs, Section Chairs
- encouragement for people to stand for committees.

The Australian caucus sets out to achieve a greater awareness of IFLA in Australia and the work that IFLA does as the global voice of libraries.

2. Membership

The Caucus will comprise all interested Australians attending the annual WLIC.

3. Roles and Responsibilities

The Caucus will foster collaboration; and share communications and information.

- 4. Meetings
- All meetings will be chaired by the ALIA President or their delegate
- Decisions will be made by consensus (i.e. members are satisfied with the decision even though it may not be their first choice).
- Meeting agendas minutes will be provided by ALIA, this includes: preparing agendas and supporting papers, preparing meeting notes and information, organising venue and time of Caucus meeting with IFLA HQ, inviting IFLA President and / or President elect to meeting.
- Meetings will be held annually up to 1.5 hours at IFLA WLIC.
- If required subgroup meetings will be arranged outside of these times at a time convenient to subgroup members.
