This title is a thoroughly researched study of library services to children, encompassing the specialty's tradition, developments due to changing educational philosophy and information technology and recent trends. The book covers outcome-based planning, early literacy, homework centres in libraries and children's spaces. With chapters titled "Future Libraries and Future Kids: Some Alternative Visions" and "Getting It Right", this book is valuable reading for library visionaries as well as children's services librarians seeking practical advice.
