The semantic web promises to automate and support sharing, contextualisation and reuse of the vast amount of data and metadata available to our society. This book presents research into the semantic web models which offer a high level machine processable view of that information. Handbook-like sections review semantic web data storage, reasoning in the semantic web, semantic web data querying, semantic web applications, and engineering semantic web systems.
