These searches are free and tested and run live in current PubMed, providing up-to-date results on 11 key health areas, aligned with Australia's National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards. They are developed and tested by health librarians and are intended as trusted searches for use by clinicians, researchers and stakeholders who want reliable and current information. Health librarians are advised that they are not validated search filters, appropriate for use in comprehensive searching, but the terms used could be a starting point for that too. For each search a more sensitive search is also provided, and all have further options including *Australian only*, *Guidelines*, and *Quality Improvement*.

The searches are produced and endorsed by the HeLiNS (Health Libraries for the National Standards) Research Project, a joint initiative of Health Libraries Australia and Health Libraries Inc.
